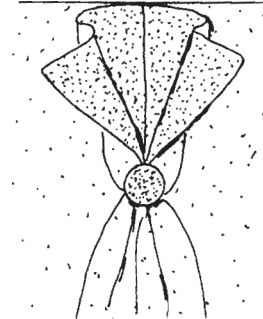


TIP OF THE MONTH JULY 2008

SPLIT GOBLET PLEAT

These pleats have a deep split in front, which exposes the lining. Sew a strip of contrast fabric to the top of a regular drapery lining. There will not be a double header, so interlining is a good addition. Crinoline (buckrum) is not used in the pleats but can be used in the space areas, if desired.



Drapery fabric Finished length, plus 8" for hem, plus 1/2" for top seam.
Contrast 5" strip Cut it 6" (you will use only a 1/2" seam at top and bottom).
Regular lining Cut it 1" shorter than the finished length (this includes a 2 1/2" double hem).
Interlining Cut it exact at finished length of drapery.
